MR. CHAIRMAN, MR. COMMISIONERS, THANK YOU FOR THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK TODAY. I AM MR. JAN SCRUGGS, PRESIDENT AND FOUNDER OF THE VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL FUND.

IN 1969 I REPORTED TO THE 199th INFANTRY BRIGADE RVN AS A PRIVATE.

BURING MY YEAR THERE ONE HALF OF MY INFANTRY COMPANY WAS KILLED OR WOUNDED. I TOO, WAS SERIOUSLY WOUNDED AND DECORATED FOR VALOR.

I'M ALIVE TODAY BECAUSE A YOUNG DRAFTEE GAVE HIS LIFE FOR ME. IN

'76 I BECAME ON OF THE YOUNGEST MEN TO PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL PSYCHOLOGICAL TESTINORY TO THE U.S. SENATE. THE SUBJECT WAS THE PSYCHOLOGICAL EFFECTS OF THE VIET NAM WAR ON ITS VETERANS..

IN THAT RECARD, I HAVE SOME KEY POINTS WORTHY OF MENTION AND THAT IS,

1. ANY DESIGN CHOSEN WOULD BE THE OBJECT OF A FEW PEOPLES MISPLACED ANGER.

THAT MISPLACED ANGER, HOWEVER, IS ESSENTIALLY ABOUT THE VIET NAM WAR

ITSELF AND THE TREATMENT OF ITS VETERANS.

IN 1979, I HAD A DREAM THAT REGARDLESS OF THE CONTROVERSY AND PIVISIVNESS CENTERED AROUND VIET NAM, THE AMERICAN PEOPLE COULD COME TOGETHER
TO BUILD A MEMORIAL TO HONOR THE SACR IFICES OF VIETNAM VETS. THAT DREAM
IS'REALITY TODAY BECAUSE WE MEET HERE TO SELECT THE STONE FOR BUILDING THAT
MEMORIAL.

MY FINAL KEY POINT IS THAT THERE IS A LOT OF UNFINISHED BUSINESS LEFT FOR OUR COUNTRY BECAUSE OF VIETNAM. THIS MEMORIAL IS A PART OF THAT UNFINISHED BUSINESS, BUT IT REMAINS FOR THE COUNTRY TO ABSORB AND RESOLVE THE MANY DIFFICULTIES THAT REMAIN FROM VIETNAM.

HUT IT CAN BE A BEGINNING. THIS YEAR, THE VVMF HELD THE LARGEST

DESIGN COMPETITION IN W.S., HISTORY. THE WINNING DESIGN IS A BEAUTIFUL

AND EXTRORDINARY WORK OF ART AND ONE THAT ALL OF US ARE VERY PROUD

TO HAVE. THE COMPARED THIS MORNING FOR EXPERIENCE TOWER.

PROBABLY 10,000 CAMB TO SEE THE ABTISTS CONCEPTION OF THAT MEMORIAL AND IT WAS EXEMPLEMENTALEMENTALEMENTALEMENTALEMENTALEMENTALE OVERWHELMINGLY ACCEPTED AS A BEAUTIFUL TRIBUTE TO THE VIETNAM VETERANS. THE JURY WAS AMONG THE MOST PROMINENT EVER ASSEMBLED TO JUDGE A WORK OF

ART. ALL WERE INTERVIEWED BY VIETNAM COMBAT VETS. THE SENIOR MEMBER OF

THE JURY WAS A COMBAT VET OF A WAR EVERY BIT AS BRUTAL AS VIETNAM, WORLD WAR I.

THE FOREMEN OF THE JURY WON THE PURPLE HEART AT ANZIO, MR. GRADY CLAY.

I RECENTLY LUNCHED WITH MR. CLAY WHO TOLD ME OF HIS AMAZEMENT AT THE

REACTION OF THE 1420 COMPETITORS WHO LOST. HE SAID THAT EUROPEAN

COMPETITIONS OFTEN HAVE AN UCLY AFTERMATH WITH WELL PUBLICIZED PROTESTS

FROM THE COMPETITORS. YET BY AND LARGE, OUR COMPETITORS HAVE SAID THEIR

REWARD WAS BEING ABLE TO COMPETE. ONE COMPETITOR EVEN HEART HAS HIS PRIZE

MONEY TO HELP WHAT BUILD THE WINNING DESIGN. ONE JUROR DONATED HIS

EXPENSES TO THE VIME

ALL COMPETITORS HAD PRECONCEIVED NOTIONS ABOUT WHAT THIS MONUMENT SHOULD BE. ONLY ONE OR TWO OF THE COMPETITORS HAVE PUBLICALLY EXPRESSED SUCH AN OPINION, ONE OF WHON WE JUST HEARD FROM.

I SOMEHOW KEEP THIS ALL IN PERSPECTIVE BY REMINDING MYSELF THAT WE ARE BUILDING A MEMORIAL THAT WILL ONEDAY BE INTERNATIONALLY RECOGNIZED AS ONE OF THE VERY FINEST MEMORIALS IN THE WORLD.
